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### **Results from MF Training Survey**

This year, the Mammary Fold carried out a survey of senior trainees (n=70) in the UK, which is the largest survey of this kind to date. We canvassed opinion on current breast surgery training and the impact of general surgery training on specialist oncoplastic breast training.

The results support the need to re-shape breast surgical training. 73% felt that current CCT requirements for emergency general surgery (EGS) and breast surgery are not realistic and do not reflect the current need of the senior breast trainees. Only 43% aspired to be EGS competent by CCT, of which the majority wanted to do so in order to keep options for future practice open. Of the 57% who did not aspire to be general surgery competent 93% felt breast trainees should come off the general surgery on call rota in the later years of training to allow them to focus on breast surgical training, which was felt to be best at the end of ST6.

Many senior breast trainees did not feel confident in achieving CCT competencies in axillary node clearance (39%), pedicle flaps (33%) and mammoplasty/augmentation/reduction (37%). In order to support the need to gain these competencies, 89% of trainees have applied/ are planning to apply for fellowships, with the TIG fellowship being the most popular (54%).

This study has revealed the concerns and views of current senior breast trainees in the UK, and we hope to publish the full results soon. We sincerely hope that the results support any discussions regarding the re-shaping of oncoplastic breast surgical training.

# National Margins audit update

The margins data collection phase is now complete. I would like to thank the investigators, including many mammary fold members, from 74 hospitals who have contributed over 2900 data sets. This is an excellent example of how successful collaborative work on a national level can be!

Our first priority is to extract data from the unit questionnaires and a review of national variation in margin practice will be submitted for publication hopefully in September. Of the 74 hospitals, we are still missing questionnaires from 15 hospitals. Investigators who have submitted margin data but not questionnaires should do SO immediately. For those who are interested in the study but have not taken part yet, it is still possible to contribute to the review in variation in practice by completing a unit questionnaire.
