ABS Conference - Mammary Fold Session

We were lucky enough to have a very varied and interesting Mammary Fold session at the ABS Conference in Belfast in May. It started with an update on the changes that are occurring to the general surgery training curriculum, and in particular breast surgery in 2018, by Mr Jonathan Lund. This is a topic relevant to all of us, and this concise and clear round-up of the changes was really appreciated. This was followed by an excellent talk on incorporating research into a clinical career, which answered a lot of questions for those of us thinking of trying to add research into our already busy rota.

Ms Isabella Dash gave an excellent account of her experience in an Australian oncoplastic fellowship, including everything from the application to applying for a visa. The opportunity to do a fellowship in Australia sounded excellent, with a busy on-call rota and the chance to gain experience in a wide range of oncoplastic techniques. This was followed by a talk on preparing for a consultant career by Mrs Julia Henderson; many of our members are approaching this stage in their careers and it helped to have first-hand advice on how to negotiate quite a scary and uncertain period.

Ms Shelley Potter gave us her update from the Mammary Fold Academic and Research Collaborative, including iBRA-2, which finished recruitment in March, and the TeaM study, recruitment for which finished on the 30th of June. As always, this was informative and very interesting.

We are currently awaiting the validation of iBRA2 data collection with the deadline 31st July 2017. The team closed recruitment on 30th June 2017 and will collect follow-up data until the end of August 2017.

We are hoping to extend NeST recruitment to Australia in an attempt to expand our collaborative research internationally.
