



Specialty Skills in Breast Surgery (Level 1): Principles in Breast Reconstruction & Implant Based Reconstruction

31st January & 1st February 2019 • Manchester Surgical Skills and Simulation Centre

The Association of Breast Surgery will be running the Specialty Skills in Breast Surgery (Level 1): Principles in Breast Reconstruction & Implant Based Reconstruction course for the first time in 2019.

Having taken over the breast specialty portfolio from the Royal College of Surgeons of England, this course will be held for the first time at the Manchester Surgical Skills and Simulation Centre.

This cadaveric & skills based course is aimed at breast and plastic surgery trainees (ST3-5) as well as consultant surgeons, associate specialists, trust surgeons, breast care nurses and reconstruction nurses wishing to develop an interest in reconstructive breast surgery.

This is an excellent introduction to the basic concepts and principles of immediate and delayed reconstructive breast surgery. This includes essential issues around patient selection, informed consent, psychological evaluation and research. It provides

in depth teaching and demonstration of current techniques in implant based reconstruction with the opportunity of cadaveric dissection in the simulated skills laboratory.

The course is targeted at clinicians who wish to have a better understanding of breast aesthetics and decision-making in breast reconstruction techniques and develop their skills in implant breast reconstruction, including the use and indications of mesh assisted and pre pectoral implant reconstruction. The course is practical and hands on, including lectures, practice mark up and cadaveric simulated procedures of the latest implant based reconstruction techniques. It is delivered by an experienced faculty of expert breast and plastic surgeons, with a high ratio of faculty to delegates.
